This course is an introduction to one of the most modern branches of economics, the theory of contest. Examples of contests are wars, trials, sports, prizes and political competition. In fact it can be considered as a resource allocation mechanism as important as the authority or the market. Only after the development of Game Theory has this branch of economics started to take shape.

To understand the main problems of Contest Theory and the most well-known solutions. To provide the students with the capacity to do research in this field.



CONTENIDOS

Contenidos teóricos y prácticos (2017-18)

- 1. Contests. Definition of a contest. Examples.
- 2. **Contest Success Functions.** Tullock, Linear, Hirschleifer, All pay auction and others. Microfoundations: Axiomatization. The setting of a single decider. Cooperative foundations.
- 3. **Properties of Equilibrium and Applications.** Symmetric Contests: Existence, comparative statics and uniqueness of equilibrium. Asymmetric Contests: Basic properties in a special case. Applications: Group contests, rent-seeking and economic performance, sabotage. Biology
- 4. **Welfare Properties of Contests.** Welfare losses of monopoly and the Coase theorem in rent-seeking societies. The design of optimal contests. Commitment problems.
- 5. **Dynamic contests.** Two stage contests. Incentives to pre commit. Who should play first? Grand Contests. Endogenous strength.
- 6. Contests with incomplete information.
- 7. Experiments in Contest
- 8. War. Rationalist explanations for wars. Are democracies more or less prone to wars than autocracies? How to avoid war.
